PORT CORPUS CHRISTI



Port Corpus Christi is one of the top ten ports in the United States. For more than 80 years we have offered shippers a profitable alternative to other crowded roads of trade. From oil and petrochemicals to agricultural and project cargo, the Port handles the goods of the world.

Port Corpus Christi lies along the Texas gulf coast, 150 miles northeast of Mexico. The warm, dry climate of South Texas and the Port's modern, multipurpose infrastructure support year-round operations, making it an ideal location for improved cost-effectiveness and greater productivity. Shipping through Port Corpus Christi gives you the advantage of a strategic central location, plus a 45' deep, straight ship channel; dockside rail from three class I carriers; excellent highway access; flexible and productive labor force; heavy lift capabilities; 125-plus acres of open storage and fabrication sites; some 300,000 square feet of covered dockside storage; and updated and expanded security operations.

The Port is adding capabilities every day. Developments include a world-class container facility, new dock and storage capacity, augmented military functions, channel improvements, and enhanced highway access. As we add services and capacity, we are constantly improving operations to insure our customers will find us the best port on the United States/Mexico Gulf coast.

Northside General Cargo Capabilities

Projects, RO/RO, Breakbulk, Refrigerated and General Cargo.

- Dockside rail or truck transfer capability.
- 122,000 square feet of shipside covered storage.
- RO/RO ramp handles bow or stern ramp vessels.
- 100,000 square foot dockside cold storage facility.

Rail and Highway Access

The Northside docks have uncongested, direct access to Interstate Highway 37 and U.S. Highway 181. Rail service is provided by *BNSF* and *UP*.

Transfer Capabilities

Cargo can be transferred on the docks directly between trucks, rail and vessels, or easily loaded or unloaded from trucks and rail on the landside of the warehouses at Docks 9 and 10. Three shipside tracks on Dock 9 and double shipside tracks on Dock 12 allow direct transfers between vessels and railcars. At Dock 9, a 48-foot wide canopy over double rail tracks allows loading of weather-sensitive cargoes.

Storage

More than 120 acres of open storage area are available for marshalling, storage and fabrication. A seven-acre, surfaced pad is located adjacent to Docks 9, 10 and the RO/RO ramp.



Southside General Cargo Capabilities

Heavy Lift, RO/RO, Breakbulk, Containerized and General Cargo.

- Dock 8, the strongest open wharf on the Gulf of Mexico with 23 acres of directly adjacent open storage.
- Docks 14 and 15, multi-purpose facilities with 173,000 square feet of covered dockside storage.

Rail and Highway Access

Southside docks have uncongested, direct access to Interstate Highway 37 and U.S. Highway 181. Rail service is by *BNSF*, *KCS* and *UP*.

Transfer Capabilities

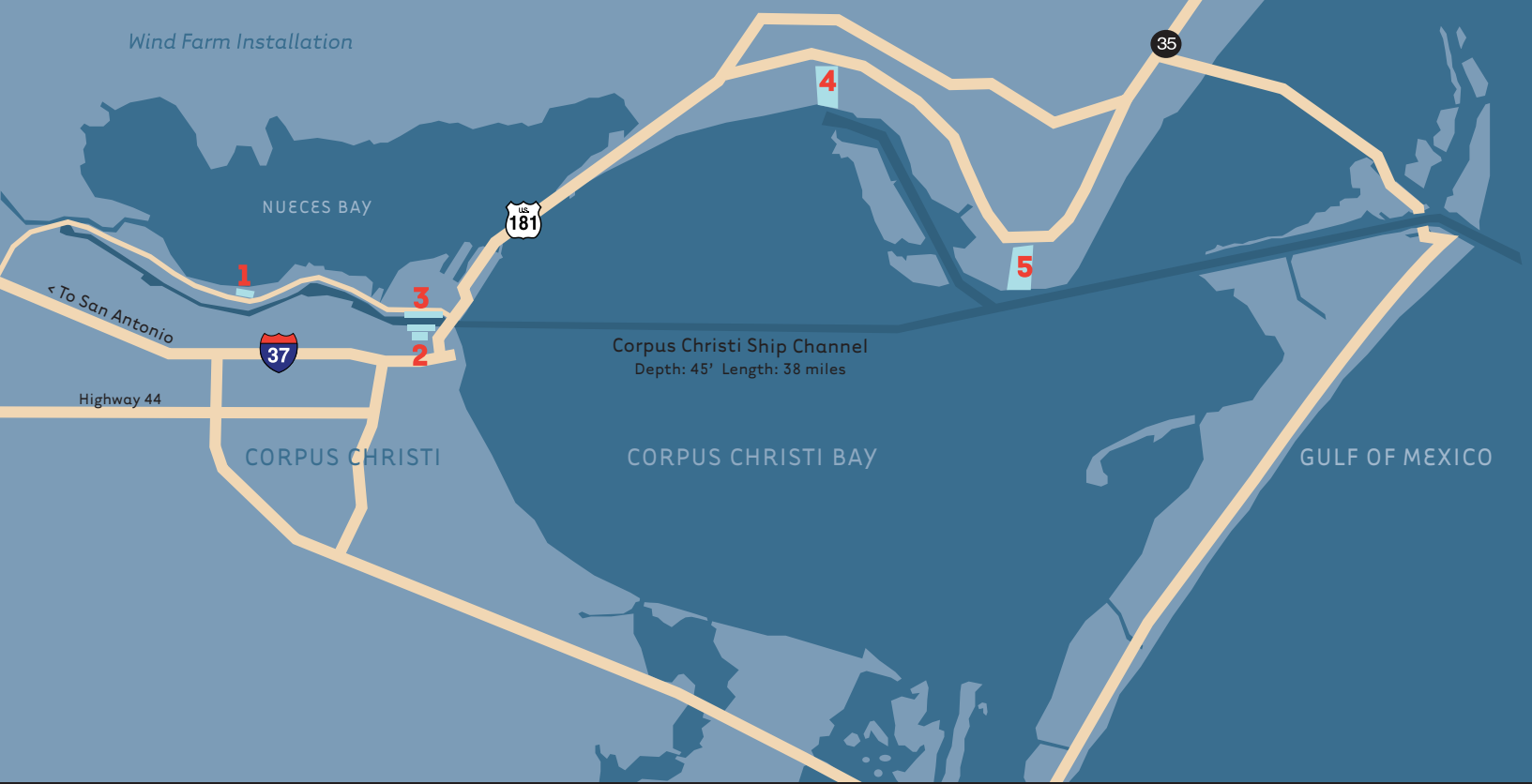
The General Cargo Terminal can transfer containers, RO/RO, heavy lift, breakbulk and project cargo between vessels, railcars, chassis and trucks. On-dock tracks allow direct transfer between vessels and railcars. Docks 8, 14 and 15 are served by double rail tracks. Dock high aprons and portable RO/RO ramps are available. A high-speed bagging line near Dock 15 is fed from rail or truck hopper dump.

Cranes and Equipment

Two 90,000lb capacity lift machines handle containers and other cargo. Additional heavy lift capacity is available.
