Port of Corpus Christi Celebrates Mariners on National Maritime Day

Port authorities plan activities to highlight and honor contributions of employees and seafarers

Corpus Christi, TX, USA – The Port of Corpus Christi, the fourth largest port by tonnage and number one crude oil export port in the United States, today celebrates the men and women who serve the U.S. Merchant Marine industry as part of National Maritime Day, highlighting the vital contributions they make in facilitating global trade.

At various events throughout the day, each Port facility will host a small celebration for its employees. Later this evening Port staff will present gift bags to mariners at the Corpus Christi International Seaman's Center. The Port has also placed ads commemorating National Maritime Day in local newspapers.

National Maritime Day was declared by Congress in 1933 to call attention to America's proud maritime heritage and to honor the men and women who serve and have served as U.S. merchant mariners.
